I am writing to address the misrepresentations that were recently made in a letter from Carl B. Johnson of Millville about TrackRacket (The News, Jan. 27, "NJMP opponents seeking to get rich while closing facility.")

As one of the creators of TrackRacket, I am much more qualified to know why the organization was created and what we are trying to do. It is disturbing that someone who is not in any way affiliated with our organization would attempt to speak on our behalf.

TrackRacket was created for one reason: To address the excessive noise generated by the New Jersey Motorsports Park and how this noise pollution inevitably contributes to falling property values in the nearby neighborhoods. It was not formed as a money-making venture, but as a vehicle for resident voices to be heard above the din of the racing cars in our neighborhood.

As citizens, we have the right to bring a claim against an entity that is creating egregious noise and affecting the quality of our lives. TrackRacket is not trying to close the NJMP, but is putting pressure on officials to address the park's negative influence on our community. TrackRacket is a voice for the community.

Since we are currently in litigation with the city and the park, we cannot comment further. However, it is important to clarify what our intent was in creating TrackRacket as well as what our goals are in bringing litigation.
